

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

LIHEAP stands for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program. It may be able to help you pay your energy bill. LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps low-income households pay for heating or cooling in their homes, and many Californians in need may qualify. LIHEAP can offer a one-time payment to help you:

- Pay your heating or cooling bills, even if you use wood, propane or oil.
- In an emergency or energy crisis, such as a utility disconnection.

LIHEAP can also provide in-home weatherization services to improve energy efficiency, reduce heating and cooling costs, and improve health and safety.

Low-income households spend a large share of their income on home energy costs:

- Low-Income Families Spend 22.8% of Income on Home Energy
- Highest Income Families Spend 2.9% of Income on Home Energy
- About 20 million or 1 in 6 U.S. households are in arrears

FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2023

The LIHEAP Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) provides financial assistance to reduce heating or cooling costs for low-income households.

The LIHEAP Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP) provides assistance to low-income households in a crisis such as a utility disconnection or energy-related emergency. ECIP Heating and Cooling Services (HCS) may help with an emergency repair or replacement of a home heating or cooling system.

The LIHEAP Weatherization Program provides services to improve home energy efficiency to reduce energy usage and costs, while improving health and safety. Services include weatherstripping, insulation, caulking, water heater blankets, heating/cooling system repairs, energy-efficient lighting, thermostat repair or replacement, and other measures.
